AMP started working on a hydroelectric power plant at the Cannelton Locks and Dam in 2009. The facility sits on the Kentucky side of the Ohio River near Domtar. Crews recently completed Phase I, and the company recently accepted bids for Phase II of the project, which includes the construction of the power house and other needed items for the plant.
